As some of our capital upgrades are being completed, construction continues on a major project in our Southern Operating Area. The Oak Hill based project in Fayette County consists of installing over 1,300 feet of 12-inch PVC pipe. This modernization will improve our flow to customers in Southern West Virginia and connect two main lines together.
