Purpose:

This advice letter filing seeks to clean up and clarify Monterey County District tariffs. The changes include:

- Deleting expired surcharges/verbiage no longer applicable such as the CWP #1 Surcharge and the Conservation Surcharge
- Updates to verbiage for consistency between the MO-1-SF, MO-1-MF, MO-1C, and MO-1O tariff packets
- Updates to the base rate table to show Monterey Main, Bishop, Hidden Hills, and Ryan Ranch rates with built-in surcharges
- Adding a Residential Fire Protection Service (RFPS) table to clarify service charge rates in the Single Family and Multi-Family tariff packets.

The changes do not impact authorized rates. Additionally, Cal-Am requests to implement its authorized 2016 non-residential WRAM/MCBA surcharges based on the authorized balance in Advice Letter 1163-B.

Background:

Advice Letter 1149 was filed on January 30, 2017, in compliance with D.16-12-003 and was the last major change to the Monterey County District tariffs. That advice letter was approved and became effective on March 1, 2017. Although that advice letter created a base rate table for the Single Family and Multi-Family tariffs, it did not update the Non-Residential and Other tariff packets. AL 1172 inadvertently removed Bishop & Ryan Ranch and Hidden Hills from the table. Cal-Am proposes to correct the table and include all service areas.

In addition, the Advice Letter 1149 did not delete surcharges such as the CWP #1 surcharge, which is no longer reflected on customers' bills.

Lastly, the R.F.P.S changes are being proposed to clarify the R.F.P.S service charges for qualifying customers in the Monterey County District.

Request:

Cal-Am is requesting authorization to clean up and clarify its Monterey County District tariffs.

Tier Designation:

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No.96-B and this advice letter is designated as a Tier 1 filing.

Effective Date:

Pursuant to D.15-04-007, California American Water requests an effective date of August 30, 2018.

RESPONSE OR PROTEST¹

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this AL. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds² are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.
- 7. A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

DWA must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, <u>please include the utility name and advice letter</u> <u>number in the subject line.</u>

- 2. A surcharge is included on each bill to collect franchise taxes and/or business license fees paid to various municipalities. The amount collected is based on a percentage of the gross revenues of each bill. The percentage are as follows: Ryan Rach 2.05%, City of Pacific Grove 2.10%, City of Carmel-by-the-Sea 2.15%, City of Seaside 1.00%, City of Del Rey Oaks Business License Fee 0.11%, City of Del Rey Oaks Franchise Fee 2.00%, City of Sand, City 0.14%, City of Monterey 1.05%, and unincorporated areas of Monterey County 1.00%.
- 3. Per Advice Letter 1142-B, a surcharge of \$1.21 for the Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance Program ("LIRAP") Balancing Account will be collected from all non-low income water and wastewater customers and will remain in effect until updated as part of Cal-AM's GRC for the 2018 test year.
