TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

California-American Water Company (Cal-Am) (U210W) submits this advice letter, including the following tariff sheets applicable to all Monterey County District water customers.

Purpose:

This advice letter filing is to comply with Decision (D.) 18-12-021, Ordering Paragraph 14, which requires Cal-Am to establish the Monterey District leak adjustment balancing account. In accordance with D.18-12-021, Cal-Am requests the Montery District leak adjustment balancing account be a one-way balancing account with an annual budget of \$2,370,879. The Montery District leak adjustment balancing account will track revenue collection shortfalls attributed to Cal-Am-provided customer billing adjustments.

Background:

Cal-Am has historically provided courtesy leak adjustments to its customers, including customers in its Monterey County District. A leak adjustment is a credit provided to a customer for abnormal water use caused by presumed leaks that occasionally occur after the customer meter on the customer's property. The adjustment is the difference between the actual water bill and the adjusted water bill. The Monterey District has steeply inclined tiered rates, and therefore, bills with excess usage tend to be significantly higher than bills in other districts. In addition, the Monterey County district has unique water constraints that do not allow Cal-Am to adjust the consumption levels on customer bills. The Commission previously determined that leak adjustments benefit ratepayers and that Cal-Am should be able to recover the lost revenus from these adjustments.¹

In Special Request #8 of Cal-Am's 2016 GRC, Application 16-07-002, Cal-Am requested authority to create an AMI/Leak Adjsutment balancing Account. The Commission denied Cal-Am's request in D.18-12-021, but, as stated above, the Commission did allow Cal-Am to establish a Leak Adjustment Balancing Account for Monterey County. Specifically, D.18-12-021, Ordering Paragraph 14, provides:

14. Within 30 days of the issuance of this decision, California-American Water Company (Cal-Am) shall file a Tier 1 advice letter establishing the Monterey District leak adjustment balancing account. The balancing account shall be a one-way balancing account with an annual budget of \$2,370,879. The balancing account shall be reviewed for reasonableness in Cal-Am's next General Rate Case. All leak adjustments found unreasonable will be removed from the balancing account and if the annual balance found reasonable is less than the approved annual budget, the difference will be refunded to ratepayers in the next General Rate Case.

Additionally, Cal-Am's current leak adjustment guidelines were approved in advice letter 1173 on September 7, 2017, with an effective date of January 1, 2018.

Request:

Pursuant to D.18-12-021, Ordering Paragraph 14, Cal-Am requests a one-way Monterey District leak adjustment balancing account for the Monterey County Distict with an annual budget of \$2,370,879. This balancing will track customer leak adjustments, as well as, surcharges collected in the Monterey County District. In addition Cal-Am will refund customers portions of the collected surcharges if the Commission deems any leak adjustment to be unreasonable and if Cal-Am collects amounts in excess of the authorized leak adjustment budget. Any amounts subject to refund will be returned to ratepayers in the next General Rate Case.

Tier Designation:

This advice letter is submitted pursuant to D.18-12-021 and General Order No. 96-B, and is designated as a Tier 1 filing.

Effective Date:

California American requests an effective date of January 22, 2019, the date of filing.

RESPONSE OR PROTEST²

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this AL. When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds³ are:

(1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;

- (2) The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

Water Division must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, <u>please include the utility name and</u> advice letter number in the subject line.

California-American Water Company requests to establish the Monterey County District Leak Adjustment Balancing Account (LABA).

1. PURPOSE:

In accordance with D.18-12-02, the purpose of the one-way Monterey County District Leak Adjustment Balancing Account is to track the difference between the \$2,370,879 authorized leak adjustments in base rates and actual leak adjustments provided, if they are less than \$2,370,879 on an annual basis.

2. APPLICABILITY:

This is applicable to California American Water's Monterey County District including Monterey Main, Ambler Park, Ralph Lane, Garrapata, Chualar, and Toro Service Areas.

3. ACCOUNTING PROCEDUSE:

The following entries shall be recorded to the balancing account and added to the prior accumulated monthly balance:

- a. This is a one-way balancing account, whereby California American Water will refund customers through the Monterey County District base rates:
 - If California American Water provides less than \$2,370,879 in leak adjustments on an annual basis, the difference between the \$2,370,879 and the actual leak adjustments provided will be credited to the Monterey County District Leak Adjustment Balancing Account.
 - ii. Any amounts subject to refund will be credited to customers as determined in the district's next rate case.

4. RATEMAKING PROCEDURE:

California American Water will include the \$2,370,879 annual budget for the Balancing Account in base rates during this GRC cycle subject to refund if the actual leak adjustments incurred are less than the \$2,370,879 authorized amount.
