**PURPOSE**

The purpose of this advice letter filing is to request recovery of the 2018 WRAM & MCBA balances. This request is in compliance with authorizations of the California Public Utilities Commission as detailed in D.08-11-023, D.12-04-048, D.13-07-041 and D.18-12-021.

**BACKGROUND**

D.09-07-021 originally approved the WRAM & MCBA for Monterey. Certain requirements from the original process were modified in D.13-07-041. Notably, the settlement adopted by the decision agreed to certain procedures outlined D.12-040-048, which Cal-Am was not a party to.

*The parties agree that California American Water would use the same amortization schedules and procedures that were established for other Class A water utilities in D.12-04-048 for the WRAM/MCBA in all districts.*

*This includes:*

- 1. Amortization of net WRAM/MCBA balances at or above 2% of the last authorized revenue requirement, as described in Ordering Paragraph 2;*
- 2. The process to not initiate the cap until 2015, which is the first test year of the GRC to be filed July 1, 2013, as discussed in Ordering Paragraph 3;...*
- 3. A vigorous review of the WRAM/MCBA as well as sales forecasting to be conducted in the next GRC (Test Year 2015), as discussed in Ordering Paragraph 3;*
- 4. Cal Am will submit its annual request for amortization of net WRAM/MCBA balances by a Tier 1 advice letter on or before March 31, as described in Ordering Paragraph 5;*
- 5. California American cannot include any additional type or category of cost in their Tier 1 Advice Letters that was not included in their Annual Report as described in Ordering Paragraph 9;*
- 6. California American Water will separate the WRAM/MCBA surcharges on customer bills if it is capable of doing so with its new billing system, as discussed for other utilities in Ordering Paragraph 10.*

Further, D.16-12-003 addressed the recovery of balances through December 31, 2014. The decision authorized a meter based surcharge over five years. This was implemented through the filing of advice letter 1146-A. The decision also modified the recovery method for future surcharges and imposed a new noticing requirement. Ordering paragraph two states,

- 1. Future Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism/Modified Cost Balancing Account (WRAM/MCBA) advice letters filed and served by California- American Water Company (Cal-Am) for the Monterey District shall request recovery of under-collections (or refunds of over-collections) by a uniform surcharge (or surcredit) on each unit of water sold (volumetric rate) including Tier 1. This applies to all WRAM/MCBA balances recovered once the new rate design is implemented. Cal-Am shall provide customer notice of each such advice letter consistent with General Order (GO) 96-B. In addition, for each of the next three advice letter requests, Cal-Am shall notify all customers in the Monterey District by bill insert or direct mail of the request even if that notice is not otherwise required by GO 96-B. The Notice shall be approved by the Commission's Public Advisor before it is issued by Cal-Am.*

In addition, D.18-12-021 increases the cap on amortization of the WRAM/MCBA balances:

*Ordering Paragraph*

*151. The cap on amortization of WRAM/MCBA balances should not be eliminated but should be increased to 15% of the last authorized revenue requirement for each of Cal-Am's districts.*

On November 7, 2018, prior to issuance of D.18-12-020, California American Water obtained an extension of time to able to file its 2018 WRAM/MCBA annual report and its Tier 1 annual request for amortization of net 2018 WRAM/MCBA balances. Without knowing the interim rate true-up, California American Water was not able to make the necessary calculations to submit these 2018 WRAM/MCBA filings. On August 8, 2019, California American Water received a second extension, to September 23, 2019.

Per D.16-12-003 California-American Water Company was ordered to provide notice to each of its Monterey customers requesting WRAM/MCBA recovery. The notice must first be approved by the Commission's Public Advisor. Attached to this filing is California American Water's draft notice, which after receiving approval from the Public Advisor, will be sent to customers as a bill insert.

#### **REQUEST**

The existing cap on the annual recovery of the WRAM/MCBA surcharge was raised from 10% to 15% of the authorized revenue requirement by the Commission in D.18-12-021. California American Water requests approval of the 2018 WRAM/MCBA balance and the associated tariff language but is not requesting an amortization and placement into rates at this time. California American Water requests in this advice letter to net the 2018 under-collected balance with the 2017 under-collected WRAM/MCBA balance. This request will allow the current surcharge recovery associated with the 2016 balances to remain the same but allow for a more timely recovery of the 2017 WRAM/MCBA balance. It would further reduce interest and improve inter-generational inequities.

The balances for the WRAM and MCBA are summarized in the table below.

5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.
7. A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

Per Advice Letter 1230-B, the under-collected balance in the Monterey County District Consolidated Expense Balancing Account will be recovered through a quantity based surcharge of \$0.0827 per 100 gallons over 24 months effective May 1, 2019. - 12. Per Advice Letter 1265, the net under-collected balance of the 2017 and 2018 residential WRAM/MCBA is \$2,796,724, including interest. D.18-12-021 raises the cap on WRAM/MCBA surcharges to 15% of the authorized revenue requirement. Since the existing 2016 surcharge meets this cap, there is no charge on the bill at this time. If the WRAM/MCBA was billed based on the balance, the current authorized consumption, and the adopted schedule per D.12-04-048 Appendix A, the volumetric surcharge per 100 gallons over 12 months. After cessation of the 2016 surcharge, a separate Tier 1 filing will be made at that time to update the tariff language and surcharge with the then current authorized amortization.

10. Decision 12-06-040 authorized Carmel River Reroute and San Clemente Dam Removal Project costs to be included in the San Clemente Dam balancing account. Per Decision 18-12-021, California American Water will recover the regulatory asset / San Clemente Dam balancing account in base rates over a 20-year period starting January 1, 2018. Current authorized recovery of \$7,921,004 per annum is included in base rates.
11. Per D.18-12-021 a meter based bill credit for the Excess Non-Plant Accumulated Deferred Income Tax will be refunded to customers over the 24-month period beginning August 1, 2019.

12. Per Advice Letter 1265, the net under-collected balance of the 2017 and 2018 residential WRAM/MCBA is \$2,488,319, including interest. D.18-12-021 raises the cap on WRAM/MCBA surcharges to 15% of the authorized revenue requirement. Since the existing 2016 surcharge meets this cap, there is no charge on the bill at this time. If the WRAM/MCBA was billed based on the balance, the current authorized consumption, and the adopted schedule per D.12-04-048 Appendix A, the volumetric surcharge would be \$0.1361 per 100 gallons over 12 months. After cessation of the 2016 surcharge, a separate Tier 1 filing will be made at that time to update the tariff language and surcharge with the then current authorized amortization.
